BREADMAKING COURSE

This was attended by eleven members on 25 March, and was held at the Landgirls' Cookery School at Atherstone. We were greeted with cherry scones fresh from the oven, and delicious chocolate cakes – a good start to the day!



We learned about different types and textures of flour from our tutor, Annelise, and then under supervision set to work on our first batch of dough for a loaf. Whilst this was proving, we made a second batch of dough to be made into rolls, which we filled with a variety of savoury ingredients such as pesto, wholegrain mustard, different cheeses and pancetta.

Whilst all these were baking, it was back to the cakes (plus Jenny Mills' birthday cake!). Once out of the oven, we carefully packed our loaves and rolls and returned home, well equipped to try out further bread-making in the future.
