Non paid-up members: Problems are caused by people who have not paid their subs, especially for groups that are organising outings. There is no way for these groups to know whether all the people going on the outings are up to date with memberships. A list of people who have not yet renewed membership for this year was passed around group leaders to enable them to check their own groups and for them to update the list by removing names of those who have moved out of the area, in care homes and those who have died.

After much discussion it was suggested that in future in **July** a list of those_who have not paid should be given to group leaders to update as above and possibly they could offer to bring subs to a meeting for them. All information to go back to Sue. Then in **September:** those who have still not renewed could be contacted individually to be asked whether they wished to continue their membership (although this could be arduous.) <u>Or</u> their names could just be erased from the list.
