BIRDWATCHING

Fifteen members of the Bird Watching Group visited Brandon Marsh in Warwickshire on Friday 27 February. We were lucky in that it was a bright morning with very good visibility. The lakes looked lovely under the sunshine with the bare trees reflected in the water. Between us we saw a good variety of birds including tufted ducks, oyster catchers, great crested grebes, snipe and cormorants. The hides made for excellent viewing.

Afterwards we all had a very good meal in the restaurant which offers a wide choice of menu. Brandon Marsh is well worth a visit, taking about 35 minutes from Countesthorpe. It would suit any age, from infants upwards, and costs just £1.50 for senior citizens to get in.



On 5 March Anne Strang gave the group a fascinating talk on her visit to Gambia. She presented pictures of the many varied birds she had seen, culminating in the ospreys which had made the lengthy and dangerous journey from Rutland Water and were enjoying the warmth of the Gambia. To local Gambians these lovely birds are commonplace and they would be astonished at the excitement which greets their return here to Rutland Water. Well, the ospreys *have* returned! If you have internet access go to www.ospreys.org.uk to enjoy stunning pictures and video clips.

Inspired by Anne's talk, nine of our group visited the Egleton reserve at Rutland Water on 27 March, which turned out to be a hive of activity, with shelduck, pinkfooted geese, widgeon, great crested grebe, plover and many more birds on display.
